the said I of my

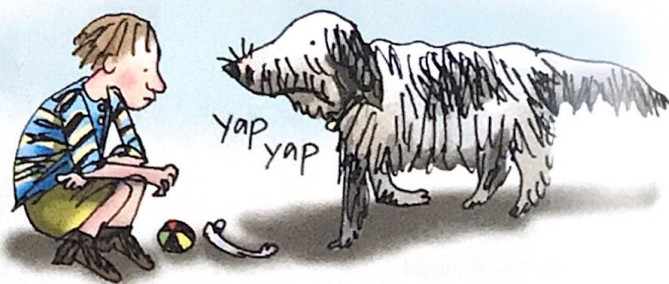
This is Ben.

said the vet.

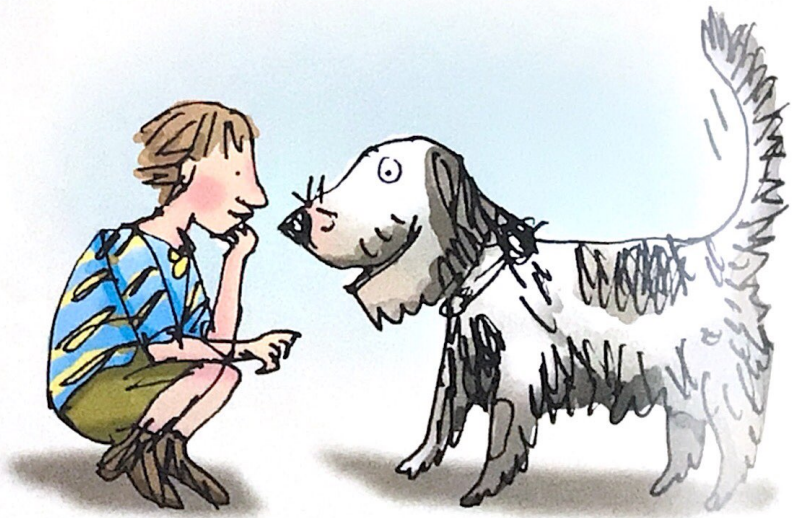
Rub rub
