I hope you enjoyed making your comic strips yesterday. What do you think of the book so far?


Today, you are going to be thinking about how Shen feels at different points in the chapter. We are going to be making **inferences**.

Making inferences is all about being a book detective and looking for clues in the text to help you ©

When Shen turned to look for the snowmobile, it was nowhere to be seen.			


