



Our approach

We have introduced Read Write Inc which is a complete systematic and structured literacy programme.

Meets the demands of the new national curriculum, giving your children the best chance of success.



How does it work?

Starting at the beginning...Early Years

Read storybooks and non-fiction books closely matched to their developing phonic knowledge

Read with fluency and expression

Learn to spell using known sounds

Write confidently by practising what they want to write out loud first

Work well with a partner



How does it work?

Aim at the end of Year 1...

Children are accurate and speedy readers and are ready to move onto class English lessons

One-to-one tutoring - no child is left behind.

Reading books align with the sounds learnt in class.






Alien words!



Fluency

Reading is not just decoding. Fluency and accuracy in reading are vital.

Children who are decoding as they read will not understand what they are reading.

Fluency occurs when children can read over 100 words per minute.

Children must read like a story teller.

Read Write Inc helps most children achieve this.

Assessment

All staff at St. Joseph's are Read Write Inc trained.


Stage not age – children are grouped based on their reading level and will be regrouped regularly.

Children are taught in groups according to their reading ability and so your child may be in a group with younger or older children. This will enable us to teach your child more effectively; children do not struggle because the work is too difficult or get bored because the work is too easy. They will access 100% of every lesson

Diagnostic assessments are carried out by the reading leader half termly for each child individually every 6-8 weeks. Any individual concerns are raised with the class teacher and senior leadership. The assessments are used to inform groupings.

Lesson Structure

Reception Class – 30 minute lesson consisting of speed sounds and word time.

Red Ditty Books and beyond – one hour lesson per day

Phonics Screening Check

The National phonics screening check is a statutory assessment that was introduced in 2012 to all Year 1 pupils.

All year 1 pupils take the phonics screening check in June.

It comprises of a list of 40 words; 20 real words and 20 nonsense words.

It will assess phonics skills and knowledge learnt through reception and year 1.

RWI fully prepares the children for this test.

Remember

When reading with your child at home, it is meant to be easy! They are consolidating what they have learnt at school, not learning anything new. If they find it too difficult they will not enjoy reading at home. Reading is a pleasurable activity.

1-accuracy

2-building fluency

3-expression, reading like a storyteller



How can I help at home?



Storytime

- Read *to* your children
- Ask lots of questions and share opinions

Talking

TALK to your child as much as possible and ‘feed’ them new and ambitious vocabulary.

“Let’s **eat** our lunch now.”

“Let’s **munch** our lunch now.”

“Let’s **scoff** our lunch now.”

“Let’s **devour** our lunch now!”

You’re looking ... not just... but...



Vocabulary

Enrich conversations through description:

“Look at that rain. It looks like little diamonds sparkling on the window pane!”

Have fun with words and language.

“I’m as hot as a spud in a cooking pot!”

Praise your child for using new words or interesting phrases
