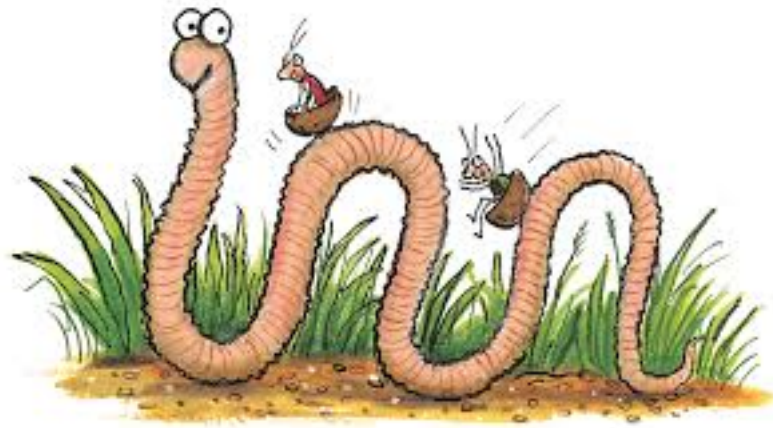

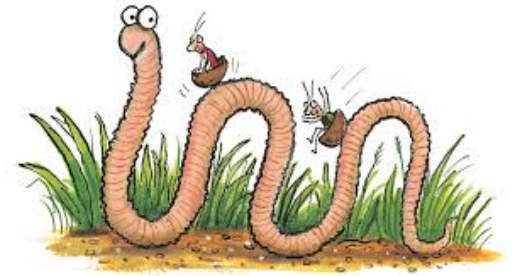

Questions are **sentences** that **ask something**.

They **need an answer**. **Question** sentences **begin** with a **capital letter** and **end with a question mark**.

Example:

Where is **S**uperworm today**?**

Think of some questions to ask Superworm. Record your ideas on the sheet on the next page – or just on paper.

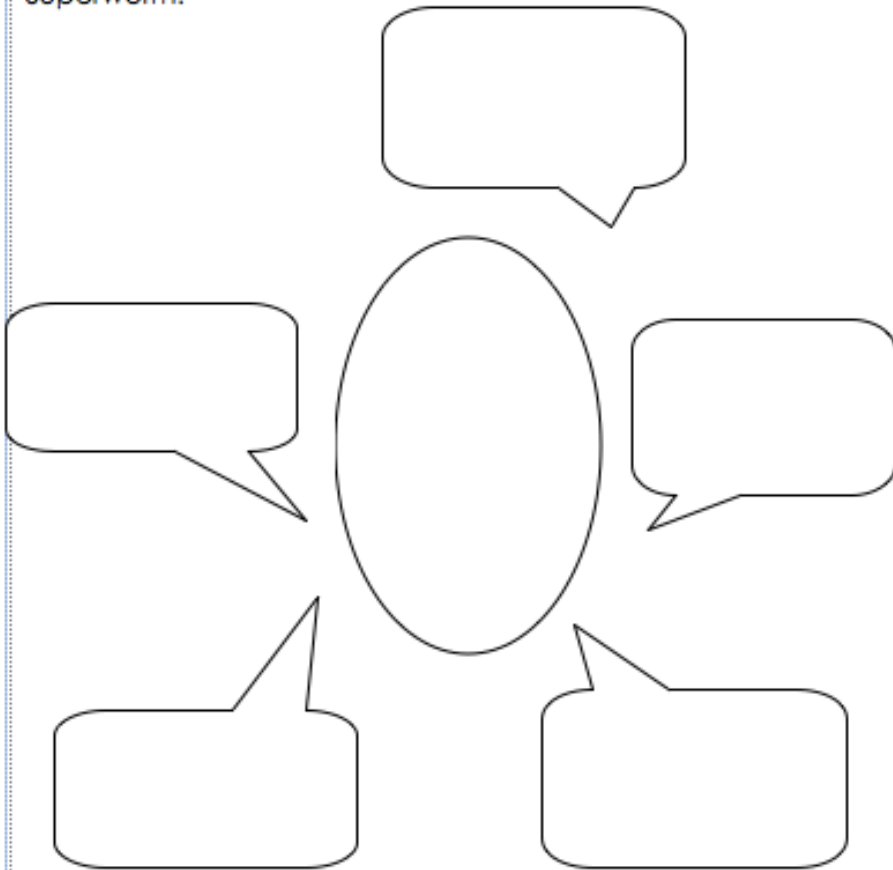
Then think of how Superworm might answer these questions. Add what you think Superworm might say to the sheet.
