
Activity 1: Listen to the story

Expanded noun phrases



We are going to use the adjectives we collected on Tuesday and our knowledge of similes from our work yesterday to write a description of Harry.


Expanded noun phrases



Look at this picture.
It would be easy to describe the rabbit in the picture.

If I said:
The little rabbit...

You would know which rabbit I mean because there is only one!



Expanded noun phrases



Now look at this picture.

If I said:

The little rabbit...

Would you know which rabbit I was talking about?

Probably not because the description is not precise enough.



This is why you need to know how to create expanded noun phrases.

Expanded noun phrases



Revision: Expanded Noun Phrases

A noun phrase is a group of words which describes a person, animal, place or object (a noun), it is joined by a verb (a doing word).

Example: The whale is swimming.





We can **expand** the noun phrase by adding adjectives.

The magnificent whale is swimming.

Expanded noun phrases





We can add 'with' to the end of our phrase to expand it:

The magnificent whale with huge fins is swimming.

Noun phrase + with = expanded noun phrase



Expanded noun phrases



To make our noun phrase even more interesting we can add some extra detail about the verb (doing word). We can add a prepositional phrase to give more detail.

The magnificent, silver whale is swimming in the sparkling, blue ocean.



This helps us to imagine exactly what the author is writing about.


Activity 3: Write a description of a character

Activity 4: Write a description of a character

My Example:

Harry Colebourn was a young man who grew up in Winnipeg in Canada. He was tall with sandy hair and eyes that were as blue as the ocean. He had hands that were both gentle and as warm as sunshine. This was just as well, as Harry's job was as a veterinarian. Harry was quite a good-looking young man who was more handsome than ever in his army uniform. Harry was also kind, caring and very compassionate. He loved animals and treated them with love and respect. He cared so much he even adopted a young bear cub. He raised the cub so well that she grew up to become the most famous bear in the world.


