# What kind of person was Jonah at the start?

The story says Jonah was a prophet.

A prophet is someone who is a good friend to God.

But he didn't listen to God. Instead he ran away! **Do you think Jonah made a good choice?**  When he was on the boat, there was a storm? Why do you think that happened?

Jonah was thrown overboard. He was then swallowed by the whale!

His time inside the whale gave Jonah time to think, pray and say sorry. God listened to Jonah, forgave him and he was saved. Why do you think God did this?

Jonah changed his ways and did what God asked.

# How did Jonah change throughout the story?

Even though he was a good friend to God, at the start of the story Jonah didn't listen and turned away from God. He tried to hide But God knew where Jonah was and sent a storm.

The other people on the boat threw Jonah into the sea where he was swallowed by a whale.

When he was inside the whale Jonah thought about his actions, said sorry and prayed. God listened and saved Jonah.

Once he was safe on dry land, Jonah changed his ways and did what God asked. He was God's friend again.

What happens if we say sorry and change our ways? Will we be forgiven?


