Focus Word



Spelling pattern:

This week, we are looking at the prefix 'dis'.

- A prefix is a letter or letters added to the start of a word to change its meaning.
- 'Dis' means 'not' or 'the opposite of'. It will give the word the opposite meaning.

For example:

disagree This is the opposite of agree. It

means that you have a

different opinion on something compared to somebody else.
