Good morning, Year 3.


Thank you for working so hard in yesterday's lesson. I hope you enjoyed planning out your story.




Before you start, look back at your planning notes from yesterday. How does your character get to the modern day? Who do they meet there?


Today, we are just focussing on **plot points 1 and 2**. We will be writing 2 paragraphs ☺.

My planning notes

Miss Robertson's example:

Stone Age girl dressed in animal skin, animal skin used for her shoes.

She is wandering in a cave when she trips and falls down, down, down into the modern day.

When she wakes up, she is in the middle of a busy street. Around her there are lots of strange moving things and lots of tall buildings. She doesn't recognise anything.

Miss Robertson's example:

Saw a strange boy in the distance. He was wearing blue trousers and a woolly jumper. He also had some strange things on his eyes. Things she might say to him:

- Where am I?
- Who are you and what are you wearing?
- What are all these strange buildings?
- How did I get here?

The boy takes the girl to meet his family.

To write this plot point, I am going to use some direct speech. I am going to be using inverted commas to write a conversation between the two characters. Use your work from last week to help you ⁽ⁱ⁾ On the next page, there are some key words and sentence starters to help you.
