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Good morning, Year 3.






Over the next few days, you are going to be writing your own story based on the Stone Age Boy. Our story is going to have a twist. Instead of falling into the Stone Age, your main character is going to be from the Stone Age and will fall into the modern day!


What kinds of things will your main character see in the modern day? Look at my examples below to spark your imagination.



Remember in school when we plan out stories using plot points? We are going to do the same today to help us to plan our story.



Use the PowerPoint slides to help you to make notes on each plot point. There is a template at the end that you might like to use ©



Plot point 1 Falling into the modern day Who is your **main character?** (Remember they must be from the Stone Age) How does your character **get into the modern day? What can they see** around them when they wake up?

## Miss Robertson's example:

Stone Age girl dressed in animal skin, animal skin used for her shoes.

She is wandering in a cave when she trips and falls down, down, down into the modern day.

When she wakes up, she is in the middle of a busy street. Around her there are lots of strange moving things and lots of tall buildings. She doesn't recognise anything.



Remember, you just need to write down key ideas. This is just a plan and not your actual story.





Plot point 2 Meeting a modern character Who does your main character meet? What do they say to each other? What questions might you ask? Where do they take your character?

#### Miss Robertson's example:

Saw a strange boy in the distance. He was wearing blue trousers and a woolly jumper. He also had some strange things on his eyes. Things she might say to him:

- Where am I?
- Who are you and what are you wearing?
- What are all these strange buildings?
- How did I get here?

The boy takes the girl to meet his family.







Plot point 3 Exploring the modern day What do the characters get up to in the modern day? What do they see? Where do they go?

### Miss Robertson's example:

The boy takes the girl to play in the park. They go for a long walk in the woods and see lots of animals like cats and dogs.

They go to the supermarket so buy some food.

They cook dinner with the food that they have bought.

They go for a drive in a car.



Think back to the work that you did yesterday on time adverbials.









How does your character get back into the Stone Age?

#### Miss Robertson's example:

They are both walking down a busy street. There are lots of cars and people everywhere. The two characters get separated and the girl trips and falls down a drain.





#### Stuck for ideas?


- Your character could go the park and swing off into the Stone Age.
- Your character could go the supermarket and lose the boy and fall back into the Stone Age.

Plot point 5 What has your character learned? What has the girl learned now that she is back in the Stone Age?

Let's look how Stone Age boy ends to help us. Instead I found I was back home. When I told my family what had happened, they didn't believe me. They said I'd only been gone a few hours and I must have fallen asleep and dreamt it.

Years passed, but I never forgot my friend Om. I am an archaeologist now (that's me in the glasses). Everywhere I go, I look in the past for signs of Om. And I never stop learning from her and her people.

Was it a dream? Maybe ...



What has the girl learned now that she is back in the Stone Age?

### Miss Robertson's example:

Woke up back in the Stone Age.

Tried to tell everyone about the adventure but no one believed her.

Showed her family some of the things that she learned in the modern day like how to cook different recipes, how to make wheels to move things around and how to build a swing to play on.

Was it a dream? Maybe or maybe not?





Think of things that your character can teach their family.
