

- Now use the words we showed you to talk about the other characters. For example, Little Red Riding Hood is next to the bridge.




- Fetch your favourite teddy bear or toy and 2 plastic cups or boxes if you're using a large object.
- Practise putting the bear or toy in different positions. Try to use every word from our language page.


TUESDAY

- Explore the room you are in. Can you describe where different objects are? For example, the plant is on the cupboard.

























WEDNESDAY


