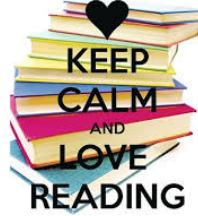

Have a go at one of these activities to practise your spellings ☺

 <p>Use Scrabble letters to spell out words.</p>	 <p>Create a collection of rocks with the alphabet painted on them to spell with.</p>	 <p>Use a tray of sand to mark spellings in it.</p>
 <p>A spurt of shaving cream spread out, then get spelling.</p>	 <p>Use magnetic or plastic letters as a practical spelling resource.</p>	 <p>Why not act out your spellings or give each word a memorable action.</p>
