believe it is that important.


The Christians who do go on pilgrimage tend to go to places because they:

A stable in Bethlehem is where the Bible says Jesus was born.




Nazareth (Israel)

St. Peter's Basilica, Rome (Italy)

Saint Peter, disciple of Jesus and first Bishop of Rome, was martyred and believed to be buried here. It is now the home of the Pope, who is the leader of the Roman Catholic Church.

Santiago de Compostela (Spain)


Saint James, one of the twelve disciples of Jesus, is believed to be buried in the cathedral.



Pilgrimages to Places Related to Saints or Miracles

The Grotto, Lourdes (France)

This is a site where Bernadette Soubirous saw visions of Mary, Jesus' mother. A spring was found and pilgrims go there as they believe the water is holy and can help cure them.



Vatican City, Rome

The Vatican City in Rome is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

It is an independent state that is run by the pope, who is the bishop of Rome and the head of the Catholic Church. Pope Francis has been the pope since 2013.

Vatican City is the smallest country in the world, with an area of approximately 110 acres and a population of around 800 people. The only people allowed to live in the Vatican City are clergy (religious people) and the Swiss Guards who are the police force of the country.





The Holy Land and Jerusalem

The Holy Land is an area in the Middle East that is holy to Christianity, Islam and Judaism. The name roughly refers to the region of Palestine. Jesus was born, crucified and died here.



Certain editions of the Bible had maps of the Holy Land, and you may recognise some of the names such as Galilee, Samaria and Judea.



Lots of people travel to Jerusalem every year to visit the places where Jesus is said to have been.

Lourdes

Lourdes is a small market town in the south of France, at the foot of the Pyrenees mountains.

Lourdes became famous across the world in 1858, when a young girl called Bernadette Soubirous claimed that she saw an apparition of Mary, Jesus' mother. It soon became one of the world's most important sites of pilgrimage and religious tourism.

The Sanctuary of Our Lady of Lourdes is an area that surrounds the grotto of Mary. It is believed that the water in this grotto has healing powers. Today, Lourdes gets around six million visitors to the town every year from all over the globe. These visitors come in the hopes of curing their illness or injuries.





Santiago de Compostela

Santiago de Compostela is the capital city of Galicia in Spain. It is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

The cathedral in Santiago de Compostela is world-famous because it is the destination of a pilgrimage route called The Way of Saint James. People have walked this route for centuries.


It is believed that the cathedral is where Saint James was buried. He was one of Jesus' apostles.





Knock

Knock Shrine is an important pilgrimage site in the town of Knock in County Mayo, Ireland.



Knock has become one of the major pilgrimage sites in Europe since then.





Fatima

Fatima is another place associated with apparitions. The shrine in Fatima, which is in Portugal, marks the spot where the Virgin Mary appeared to three shepherd children over the course of 6 months in 1917. They said that they saw a 'lady dressed in white' and shining with a bright light.

Two of the children died of the flu soon after, while the third child grew up to become a nun.

Since the apparition, there has been a small chapel, shrine, large basilica and sanctuary built and visitors flock to Fatima every year to spend time in this holy place.





Czestochowa

Czestochowa is a city in southern Poland, beside the Warta river. It is famous due to the Jasna Góra Monastery, a shrine to the Virgin Mary.

Within the monastery, there is a basilica and the Chapel of the Miraculous Painting of Our Lady. This is where you will find the Black Madonna painting, a shrine to the Virgin Mary. People come from far and wide every year to see it, as it is believed to have miraculous powers.
